

What is CAO?

(Central Applications Office)



- CAO processes Irish college applications (incl. fee paying colleges)
- Students can complete 2 choice lists (level 6/7 ordinary degrees & level 8 honours degrees)
- Students can apply for up to 10 level 6/7 courses & 10 level 8 courses
- It is possible to receive an offer from both lists

CAO Requirements

Minimum Entry Requirements:

- Level 8: typically: 2x H5 & 4x O6/H7*
- Level 7: 5xO6/H7
- (incl. maths, Eng, Irish &/Or 3rd lang.*)

Subject Specific Requirements:

Example:


- Primary teaching Mary I Irish = H4;
- Sport & Exercise Science UL Science = O3/H7;
- Mathematical Science UG Maths = H5/O1

Points Requirement:

- Total points from Students' best six subjects
- (*bonus maths)

***Additional Requirement:

- Certain courses are Restricted-Application Courses
- They have early assessment procedures
- (must apply by 1st Feb)
- E.g. HPAT; Art portfolio; Interview
- Check cao.ie



NB Research is crucial (rash decisions re subjects/ levels can be costly)

RESEARCH! Make an Informed Decision



Don't assume knowledge of a course by its title!

Don't choose a course / college based on friend's choices!

Research the modules across the 3 / 4 year degree

Are there work experience or year abroad options?

How will you be examined (group work / lab/ presentations)?

Get the college prospectus / Check college websites

Go to the Open / Taster Days

Consider the subjects you enjoy and excel in

Talk to students and friends who have completed the course

Discuss it with Guidance Counsellor

Use college websites to research modules






The Cost of College Education in Ireland 2023



Be Responsible: Check emails sent to all applicants before end of May & confirm details

<u>Central Applications Office</u> (link to CAO important dates)

How offers are issued

Example:

The applicant's leaving Certificate results are released to CAO.

CAO checks if the applicant meets the minimum entry requirements for each of their chosen courses.

CAO calculates a points score for all of the courses that the applicant is eligible for.

The applicant is placed on a list for each of their eligible courses. Their position on the list is determined by their points score relative to the other eligible applicants for that course. The list is commonly referred to as the 'Order of Merit list'.


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The colleges instruct CAO to make X number of offers for each course.

The offers are issued to applicants based on their position on the list. The applicant with the highest points score will be offered the first place, the second highest will be offered the second place, and so on until all places have been offered.



When applicants decline/
defer offers this results in subsequent places becoming available in the next round of offers in order of merit




EXAMPLE – HEIs issue R1 offers

- The applicants marked in GREEN have enough points to be offered places.
- The applicant marked in RED has enough points for her second preference.

- Red applicant got 486 points
- Their number 1 choice CK101 was 488 points
- Their number 2 choice DN201 was 470 points
- Their number 3 choice AL850 was 477 points
- Red applicant got offered their number 2 choice therefore they can not be offered number 3 - 10.
 - They MAY get offered number 1 in a later round.

Access Routes to Education: HEAR/DARE

- <u>HEAR</u> (Higher Education Access Route) a college and university access scheme which offers places on reduced points to school leavers from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds
- <u>DARE</u> (Disability Access Route to Education)
 offers reduced points places to school leavers
 who as a result of having a disability have
 experienced educational challenges in second
 level education
- Indicate on CAO form; online forms completed by March 1st & supporting documentation posted to CAO by March 15th

- Each HEAR applicant is assessed in relation to six indicators (criteria)
- Each applicant must meet at least 3 of the indicators (certain combinations allowed)

Indicator 1: Income

Indicator 2: Medical/GP Card

Indicator 3: Social Welfare

Indicator 4: Socio Economic Group





✓ <u>Section C:</u> Evidence of Disability Form

completed by approved Medical Consultant/Specialist/GP

SUSI Grant

Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI) is the single awarding authority for all grant applications www.susi.ie

Generally opens in April



Other Options

UCAS (Universities and Colleges Admissions Service) – colleges in the UK. Closing date 6pm 31st January 2024 (***MEDICINE*, *VETERINARY MEDICINE/SCIENCE*, *AND DENTISTRY = MID OCTOBER*)

EUNICAS (European Universities Central Application Support Service) – colleges in Europe (study through English).

Post Leaving Certificate, obtain FETAC (QQI) level 5/6 qualification with which student can reapply through the CAO system (alternative to repeating the Leaving Certificate). Links to Universities and TU's. Note: Some courses require specific grades for entry purposes e.g. Nursing.

Some Universities & TU's offer a **Special Maths exam** (students who missed a maths requirement)

- Huge expansion of apprenticeships in recent years
- Possible to do apprenticeships in areas such as Construction, Electrical, Engineering, Finance, Motor, IT, Accountancy and Hospitality.
- Information available on www.careersportal.ie
- On the job and college training (earn & learn!).

Further Considerations...

FEES: Student Registration fee: €3000. (if receiving the full grant students don't pay this). If a student drops out they may be liable for fees; check cut-off dates with individual colleges. Tuition fee paid by the government (will only be paid for each college year once — not for repeating a year)

ACCOMMODATION: Keep abreast of individual accommodation circumstances through their websites (lottery system/ online booking etc.)

Deferral: All the colleges & universities have different policies regarding deferrals and most expect a specific reason. If you received a CAO offer & decide to defer, do not accept the offer. Contact the College Admissions mark "DEFERRED ENTRY" clearly in the email. If you have successfully deferred & want to take your place, you will need to apply for the course through the CAO again the following year. You will need to put down your deferred course as your first and only choice; additional entries will forfeit your place and enter you back into the CAO lottery.
